The biggest names in British 60s pop: Ron knew them all, he even joined the Beatles on their last tour...



After his offshore radio adventure, Ron O'Quinn continued his radio career in his native America, where he worked for big stations in major radio markets such as Miami, Florida.

Ron first joined his fellow former offshore jocks at Radio Mi Amigo International as early as 2015. Now, after a short 2-year sabbatical from radio, Ron returned behind the microphone.

We are happy and proud to welcome him back to the old 'pirate's nest'. Conversely, Ron is thrilled to be heard again in Europe on the station that, like him, is reviving the memory of 'the Golden Era of Offshore Radio' and real 'Free Radio'. Welcome back, Ron O'Quinn!

Celebrating five years of Shortwave Broadcasting

Last Sunday, 31 October, it was exactly five years ago that Radio Mi Amigo International's shortwave transmitter first came online, broadcasting to Europe and beyond on 6085 kHz in the 49m 'Europa Band', located in a secure bunker deep underground in the German Eifel.

Initially (since 2015), the then still fledgling Radio Mi Amigo International only broadcasted during the weekends, on frequencies 6005, 3985 and 9650 kHz.

But a cozy barbecue in the spring of 2016, which took place right under the antennas of the unique 'Sende Zentrum' in Kall-Krekel, Germany, became the birth of Radio Mi Amigo International as we know it today.

That evening, the station presented itself to the world in a 3-hour live program, not only via the antenna's in Kall, but also with an extra100 kilowatts of power from a transmitter in Armenia: the 'Shortwave Radio Event of the Year'.

During the broadcast, reactions poured in from all over the world. Soon, plans arose for a dedicated transmitter that would broadcast 7 days a week on 6085 kHz shortwave in the 49-metre band.

Thanks to the great crew of ShortWave Service, on October 31, 2016, our own vintage SK1 Rhode & Schwarz transmitter on 6085 kHz went live. To this day, without any interruption, it is on the air every day, from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. [CET]

THE GHOST SHIP STILL SAILING THE RADIO WAVES... ECHOES OF A GLORIOUS RADIO PAST

Like the mystic ghost ship 'Flying Dutchman', but in the guise of a legendary 'pirate radio ship'...

Derelict, but still sailing on misty, fading radio waves, with fragments of a distant radio past...

That was the idea when 7 years ago the possibility arose to broadcast on shortwave. AM, 'Free Radio', oldies, the freedom of the sea...

...the kind of radio that only lives on in our memory, but has perished in the waves of time.

The legendary radio ship Mi Amigo, which sank in 1980, is of course the pre-eminent symbol for this. A metaphor, that fits so beautifully with those fading and crackling AM signals from mysterious shortwave stations.

Fragments of that glorious radio past, when pop culture emerged and the foundations of modern pop music were laid with the rise of bands like the Beatles, first played from radio pirate ships in the North Sea.

Many of our DJ's started their career on that mv Mi Amigo, the radio ship of Radio Caroline.

That magical place, where 'Free Radio' originated and where Johnny Walker once spoke his legendary words. "No Man will ever forget August 14th 1967..."

The legendary Mi Amigo, the longest serving radio ship of them all.

That's why Radio Mi Amigo International is proudly named after "the Old Lady'.

The heyday of this legendary radio ship, the music it first played, and the essence of 'Free Radio' is what we're trying to revive today.

(Not to be confused with the Flemish 70s radio station, which was also named after the ship, but enjoyed popularity mainly in Flanders.)
